Our support team of George Lowe and Alf Gregory followed on a second rope. It's revealing where he talks of his great shame at crying after his wife died. We were 25, feet up on the South Col, a desolate saddle between the upper slopes of Everest and Lhotse. I looked out the tent doors and could already see signs of the early morning light. However, after this great level of detail, he swung too far the other way and turned back into the bitter wind and had a fearful struggle reaching our tents again, but were greatly encouraged at how fit we still felt and how freely we could work and move at 26, feet without oxygen.
